STATE OF ISRAEL

Submitted by:

Governmental Freedom of Information Unit - Israel

Overview

- Governmental FOI Unit established by Decision No. 2950 (March 6, 2011)
- Implements Freedom of Information Act (1998)
- Mission: transparency in public authorities through guidance, training, and monitoring
- Promotes access to information







Monitoring of FOI Law Implementation

- Annual FOI report submitted to Parliament
- New regulations:
 - Publication of administrative guidelines
 - Disclosure of datasets from public reports
- Budget transparency now includes government hospitals
- 12-hour online training for FOI officers launched







Relevant Law Cases and Resolutions

Case 1: Moshav Shitufi Har Shemesh vs Israel Tax Authority (2023)

- Request denied: software specs and source code
- Court: tools not subject to FOI; reverse engineering not required

Case 2: Moshe Rogoznitsky vs Health Ministry (2023)

- Request denied: pharmacy supervision reports
- Court: unreasonable burden to review, protect sensitive data







Events to Promote ATI

- Annual FOI Officers' Forum
- Workshops with local authorities
- NGO guidance sessions
- Recognition for top FOI officers







Summary & Key Takeaways

- Trust-building through research and integration within FOI mechanisms
- Ongoing training & officer support is vital
- Raising public FOI awareness remains a top priority
















REPUBLIC OF MALDIVES

Submitted by: Information Commissioner's Office - Maldives

Overview

- Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) established
 July 2014
- Mandated under RTI Act (Law No. 1/2014)
- Responsibilities: appeals, training, awareness, and monitoring
- Independent oversight body for RTI







Monitoring of FOI Law Implementation

- 566 cases registered (2024)
 - 327 withdrawn (info disclosed)
 - 245 resolved by Commissioner
 - 66% decisions found information was wrongly withheld
- 685 staff from 173 authorities trained
- 287 citizens joined awareness activities
- 11 authorities fully complied with proactive disclosure







Monitoring of FOI Law Implementation

- Challenges:
 - Surge in appeals
 - 89% complaints due to officer non-responsiveness
 - Delays in decision-making
- RTI Regulation amended February 2024







Events to Promote ATI

- Collaborative Development Program (with IRI):
 - Trainings led to full compliance in multiple councils
- Transparency Maldives Assessments:
 - Only 0.75% of 935 authorities fully compliant
 - Many lacked functioning websites
- RTI Implementation Assessment (with CLD methodology):
 - "High yellow" score
 - Strengths in central governance
 - Weaknesses in proactive/reactive disclosure







Events to Promote ATI

- UK Government Partnership:
 - Developed implementation guidelines
 - Trained 30 agency staff
- IDUAl Celebration:
 - 10th RTI Act Anniversary
 - Multi-stakeholder panels on transparency and misinformation







Summary & Key Takeaways

- Rising demand for RTI services
- Persistent gap in proactive disclosure
- Recognition and scoring tools promote compliance
- Next Steps:
 - Institutionalize RTI training
 - Use of self-paced learning tools
 - Publish an annual RTI report















FEDERAL DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF NEPAL

Submitted by:

National Information Commission - Government of Nepal

Overview

- RTI guaranteed in the Constitution and RTI Act (2007)
- Aim: Ensure transparency, accountability, access to public information and protection of sensitive data
- National Information Commission (NIC):
 - Independent body with three commissioners
 - Enforces and promotes RTI compliance







Monitoring of FOI Law Implementation

Multi-level Monitoring Structure:

- Central Coordination: Secretary of the Office of Prime Ministers and Council of Ministers
- Implementation Monitoring: Secretary of the Ministry of Communication and Information Technology
- Provincial Monitoring: Secretary of Chief Ministerial office in all 7 provinces
- District Monitoring: Chief District Officers (77 districts)







Monitoring of FOI Law Implementation

Challenges:

- Low public awareness (RTI seen as tool for journalists)
- Harassment and delays in request handling
- Language barriers and institutional resource gaps
- No provincial NIC offices







Relevant Law Cases and Resolutions

- FY 2080–81 (2023–24):
 - 1,200 out of 1,265 appeals resolved (95%)
 - 72% from local governments
- Notable Case:
 - Activist sought unpaid electricity dues from 2070s
 - Initial refusals → NIC issued multiple disclosure orders
 - Final result: 77 industries revealed to owe 179+ billion NRs
 - Led to recovery actions showcased RTI's impact on accountability







Events to Promote ATI

- Government and CSO awareness campaigns
- Regular training for Information Officers
- Annual RTI reports published and made accessible







Summary & Key Takeaways

- Strong institutional commitment to ATI
- High case resolution rate by NIC
- Priorities:
 - Expand local-level monitoring
 - Improve public awareness campaigns
 - Strengthen training
 - Address NIC resource and capacity gaps
















ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF PAKISTAN

Submitted by: Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Information Commission

Overview

- RTI journey began with a 1997 ordinance
- Constitutional status under Article 19(A) (2010)
- KP RTI Act (2013): most progressive in Pakistan
- Covers public bodies and NGOs receiving public funds
- KP Information Commission:
 - 3 commissioners
 - Independent body for implementation, complaints, awareness, and disclosure







Monitoring of FOI Law Implementation

Key Implementation Highlights:

- Independent KP Information Commission
- Streamlined complaints process
- Proactive disclosure mandate for public bodies
- 2025 Amendment:
 - Appellate authority moved to Peshawar High Court
 - Reinforces Commission's autonomy

Challenges:

- Operational constraints due to reduced donor funding
- Limited resources affecting outreach and enforcement

- Seminars/workshops in:
 - Universities
 - Communities
 - Women's groups
- Radio campaigns: Radio Meezan (e.g., Radio Meezan, FM 92.2)
- Digital/print awareness
- Judicial Academy webinar (2024)
- Collaborations with:
 - GIZ
 - World Bank
 - Other development partners







Summary & Key Takeaways

- KP sets the benchmark for RTI in Pakistan
- Strong legal framework and active enforcement
- Key strengths:
 - Expanded Commission powers
 - Diverse public outreach
- Remaining gaps:
 - Funding constraints
 - Need for sustained stakeholder support















REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES

Overview

- Lead Agency: FOI-Program Management Office (FOI-PMO), under the Presidential Communications Office
- Mandate: Implement Executive Order No. 2, s. 2016
- Functions:
 - Manage eFOI Portal
 - Train FOI Officers and LGUs
 - Conduct awareness campaigns
 - Provide technical support for institutionalizing the FOI Program







Monitoring of FOI Law Implementation

Key 2025 Statistics:

- 340,167 eFOI users
- 684 onboarded agencies
- 6,035 FOI Officers
- 89 LGUs with FOI mechanisms
- 448,000 total FOI requests
 - 245,613 via eFOI portal
 - 202,203 standard paper-based
- Average response time: 8 working days

Major Challenge:

Temporary eFOI Portal shutdown → Manual processing of requests







Relevant Law Cases and Resolutions

Legaspi v. COMELEC (G.R. No. 264661, July 2024):

 FOI cannot compel a full manual recount in elections – undue burden on agency

Memorandum Circular No. 24-002:

Guidelines for processing FOI requests during portal maintenance

2025 FOI Awards Guidelines:

 Set criteria to recognize agencies, LGUs, CSOs, NGOs, and other development partners advancing ATI







Events to Promote ATI (2024–2025)

For Government:

- FOI Bootcamp: Three-day training for newly designated FOI Officers to build capacity.
- FRO Hangout: Annual event for FROs to share challenges and best practices.
- FOI Online Consultation System: Troubleshooting and performance support







Events to Promote ATI (2024–2025)

For the Public:

- Barangay FOI: Supporting barangays with FOI ordinances and promoting the use of the eFOI Portal
- Workshop for Librarians: FOI as research tool
- FOI Campus Caravan & Student Ambassadors Camp: Youth engagement
- Training-of-Trainers: Prepares sector-specific FOI trainers.
- CSO Hangouts: Consultations with civil society







Summary & Key Takeaways

- Maintained public access despite eFOI portal disruption
- Robust engagement with national agencies, LGUs, youth, and CSOs
- Ongoing lobbying for a comprehensive FOI law
- Extensive training programs and stakeholder engagement for long-term sustainability
















REPUBLIC OF CHINA (TAIWAN)

Submitted by: National Development Council

Overview

Key Implementing Bodies:

- Ministry of Justice (MOJ): FOI implementation and prosecutorial and legal affairs.
- Ministry of Digital Affairs (MODA): Leads open data policy (50,000+ datasets published)
- Personal Data Protection Commission (PDPC):
 Established Dec 2023; safeguards data privacy







Monitoring of FOI Law Implementation

Legal Framework: Freedom of Government Information Act (1995, amended 2023)

Supporting Guidelines & Initiatives:

- Draft Guidelines for Data Empowerment Management Architecture
- Guidelines for Privacy-Enhancing Technologies & Data Altruism Operations
- Guidelines for revised Metadata and Cross-Platform Integration
- Submission Process for High-Value Datasets

Upcoming Legal Development:

 March 2025 amendments to the Personal Data Protection Act to strengthen PDPC authority over both public and private sectors







Events to Promote ATI (2024–2025)

- AAIA Forum Presentation (March 2024): Prof. Liu Tingchi on communication and capacity-building
- Data Quality Enhancement Training: Supporting Al development and cross-agency coordination.
- Government Data Application Empowerment Forum:
 6 case studies on data-driven problem solving
- Public-Private High-Value Data Workshop: Cocreating data tools & prioritizing datasets for innovation and Al







Establishment of New Authorities

- Pending Legislation: PDPC Organization Act (submitted March 27, 2025)
- Structure: Collegial body with commissioners serving 4year terms
- Goal: Ensure independence, data protection, and effective oversight







Summary & Key Takeaways

- ROC is modernizing FOI and expand its transparency systems, combining open data, legal reforms, and stakeholder collaboration.
- Focus on data quality, safeguarding privacy, and making government data more usable for public benefit.
- Commitment to strengthening access to information in the digital age.
















DEMOCRATIC SOCIALIST REPUBLIC OF SRI LANKA

Submitted by: Right to Information Commission of Sri Lanka

Overview

- Legal Foundation: RTI Act No. 12 of 2016, rooted in Article
 14A of the Constitution
- Oversight Body: RTI Commission (RTIC), covering all public bodies and private entities using public funds
- International Standing: RTI Act was a central commitment under Sri Lanka's Open Government Partnership







Monitoring of FOI Law Implementation

RTIC Powers under Section 11:

- Issues rules on fees, appeals
- Recommends disciplinary actions
- Can initiate prosecutions
- Enforces proactive disclosure (Sec. 8–10)

Challenges:

- Staffing shortages and Budget constraints, but continues oversight and advocacy
- IMF Governance Report (2023): Recognized Sri Lanka's RTI as a global model







Relevant Law Cases and Resolutions

- Chartered Accountants Case (2025): Upheld disclosure of fraud-related records
- Rohandeera v. Chamara Sampath (2023): RTI overrides asset secrecy laws for MPs
- Litro Gas & People's Bank Cases: Disclosure ordered despite privacy/trade secrecy claims
- Pending Appeals: 36 by PAs at the Court of Appeal
 - courts consistently affirmed RTIC authority







Events to Promote ATI (2024–2025)

- Provincial Consultations: With media and CSOs to train PAs and IOs
- Proactive Disclosure Consultations: With President's and PM's
 Offices on large-scale project transparency
- Gender-Focused Initiative:
 - Led by Comm. Kishali Pinto-Jayawardena
 - Workshops on women's access to RTI
 - Culminated in publication: Breaking Barriers: Women and RTI in Sri Lanka







Summary & Key Takeaways

- Sri Lanka's RTI law is among South Asia's strongest
- Citizens use RTI to monitor government sectors including procurement and education
- Courts affirm RTIC's role despite institutional constraints
- RTI in Sri Lanka remains a vital tool for transparency, justice, and reform
